food service department.



A la Carte

A la carte snacks and beverages are available to students at North Shore Middle School. We are excited to offer a variety of fun foods such as freshly baked cookies, ice cream, chips, milk, 100% juices and water. Students must have funds available in their account to purchase these items.

Students at North and South can purchase extra milk for \$0.40. As a reminder, the meal price for a reimbursable/complete meal includes milk.



Allergies

We offer a variety of whole grain entrees, so your student is sure to find something they enjoy.


NEW this year: Starting 9/13 NSMS students will have a hot breakfast sandwich option every Wednesday. We will increase number of days/week as demand increases.

Adding funds to your family's account

Pre-pay for meals with cash, check or online payments

The HLSD requires payment in advance for school meals and milk. You can send cash or check on a weekly, monthly, or semester basis for deposit in the Student Lunch Account. You may also pay online using E-funds.

Put cash or a check (payable to the HLSD) in an envelope. On a separate sheet or on the outside of the envelope, write the names of your children. Drop the envelope off at the front office of your child's school.

To have money in your child's account on the first day of school, please make a deposit by August 31, 2023.

During the school year, money received in the morning will be recorded in time for the **next day's** lunch.

We use an automated service to send an email notice and/or phone call when your account balance has reached +\$5.00 and when there is a negative account balance. Email notices and phone calls will be biweekly.

North Shore students may ask about their account balance any time they go through the lunch line.

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Free/Reduced Priced Meal Information

The last status determination carries over until October 16, 2023, so you must submit an application to prevent a disruption in meal benefits.

The data from these applications also allows the district and/or your family to qualify for additional aid in some instances.

What's on the Menu?

We serve food kids love to eat! Freshly Baked Pizza, Crispy Chicken Sandwiches and Made-to-Order subs are just a few...

<u>American Classic</u> station rotates daily with items such as Mashed Potato & Popcorn Chicken Bowl, Orange Chicken, Breakfast-for-Lunch and more!

<u>Grilled</u> station rotates 3 choices daily with items such as Corn dog on Stick, Hamburger, and BBQ Pulled Pork Sandwich.

2mato station offers homemade cheese and pepperoni pizza everyday. Sausage is a special once a week.

So Deli station offers build you own sandwiches daily. Try them toasted!

<u>On the Go</u> station offers grab and go parfaits and salads for times when students are in a hurry or just don't want to wait.

Sono station offers Taco and Nacho bar every Tuesday and Thursday.

A meal isn't complete with out a fruit and/or vegetable, so we offer a hot vegetable of the day, a variety of fresh vegetables on our salad bar, and variety of fresh, canned, and dried fruits on our salad bar.

Breakfast entrees include homemade muffin tops, granola bars, and cereal. New this year: hot breakfast sandwiches available on Wednesdays. A variety of fruit including 100% fruit juice, milk, and hard-boiled eggs are also available to complete the meal.

What is the Cost?

NSMS offers paid student pricing in two tiers. Both tiers include entrée, fruit and/or vegetable, and milk. Students must take a fruit and/or vegetable to make it a complete/reimbursable meal. Please encourage your students to do so to get the best pricing!

Tier 1: \$3.40 (American classics, Grilled, and On the Go)

Tier 2: \$3.75 (Taco/Nacho bar, So Deli, and 2Mato)

If you think you may qualify for free or reduced priced meals, please complete an application each school year.

NSMS breakfast is \$1.80 (Includes entrée, 2 fruits, and milk. Students must choose 3 items to make a complete/reimbursable meal and one item must be a fruit.)

You can add money to your student's lunch account via efunds.

What are the a la carte options?

We offer a variety of "fun" foods for students to purchase a la carte. A sample of our offerings and prices is below.

Non-Discrimination Statement
